MISSION AND OVERVIEW

- Leadership Preparatory Brownsville Charter School (LPBV) is about College and Contribution. LPBV teaches students the academic skills, knowledge, and personal traits necessary to succeed in high school, college, and beyond. Through academic achievement, our students prepare to contribute as leaders in their communities.
- The school opened in 2009 and will serve approximately 174 students in Grades K-2 in 2010-2011. The school will grow one grade each year until we serve students in Grades K-8.

FOCUS ON ACADEMICS

Our rigorous curriculum includes over three hours of literacy instruction and 80 minutes of math instruction every day in addition to science, social studies, music, character education, and physical education.

STRUCTURED ENVIRONMENT

LPBV scholars wear uniforms and adhere to a strict code of conduct. LPBV teachers are caring and warm yet hold students to high standards of behavior that are consistent throughout the school. The result is an environment in which students focus on learning and teachers focus on teaching.

COMMITMENT TO EVERY STUDENT

Our teachers work tirelessly to ensure that all students excel. An extended school day (7:15AM – 4:00PM), after-school tutoring, student to teacher ratio of 14 to 1, and reading groups with less than 10 students allow our teachers to know each student's strengths and weaknesses and provide highly effective, differentiated instruction.

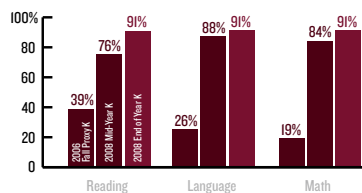
COLLEGE-PREP FOCUS

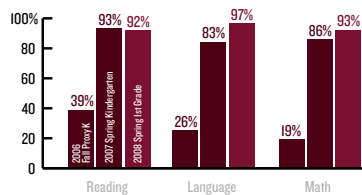
PROVEN RESULTS
