Counting Objects 1

DIRECTIONS: Practice counting with your child to help them count to at least 25 without skipping numbers. For example, if your child counts to 25, but he or she skips the number 15, then the highest number to which your child is able to count is 14. If your child does this, stop him/her and tell them the number they have missed. Then, have them restart at the number one and count again. Remember to be positive – and smile a lot! This should be fun and no stress. Always end on a high note and congratulate your child for working hard!

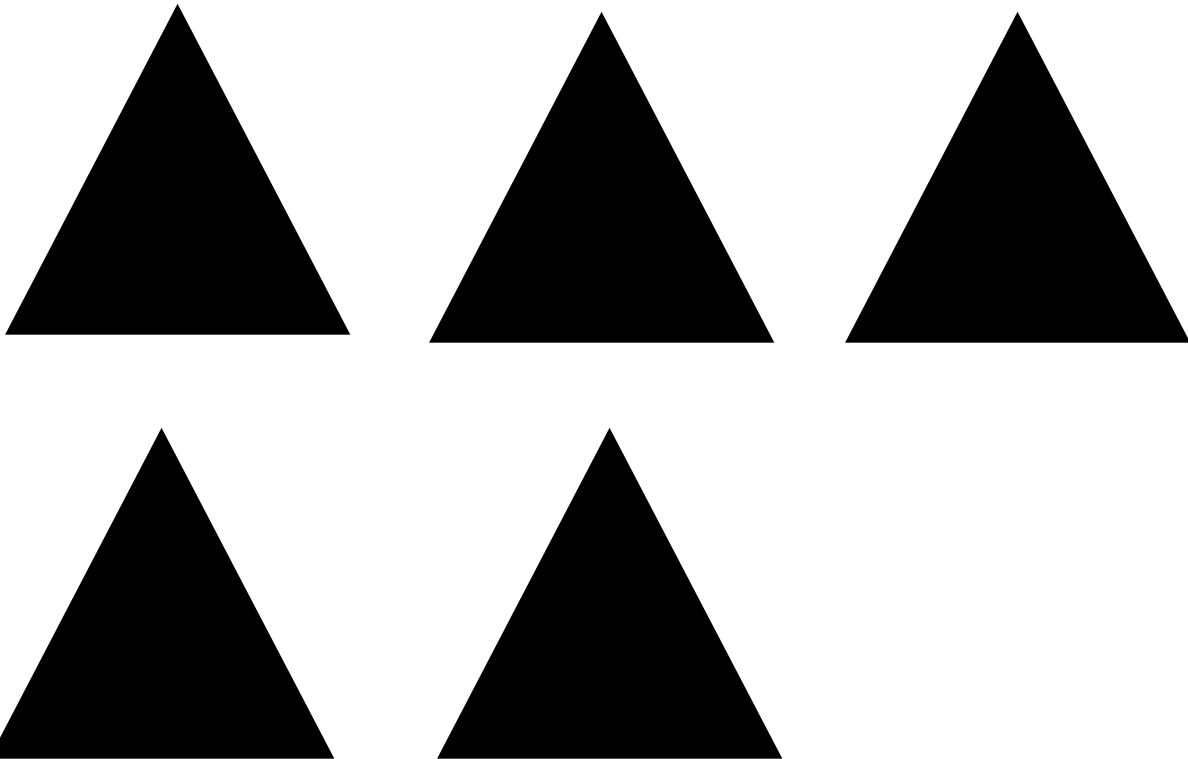

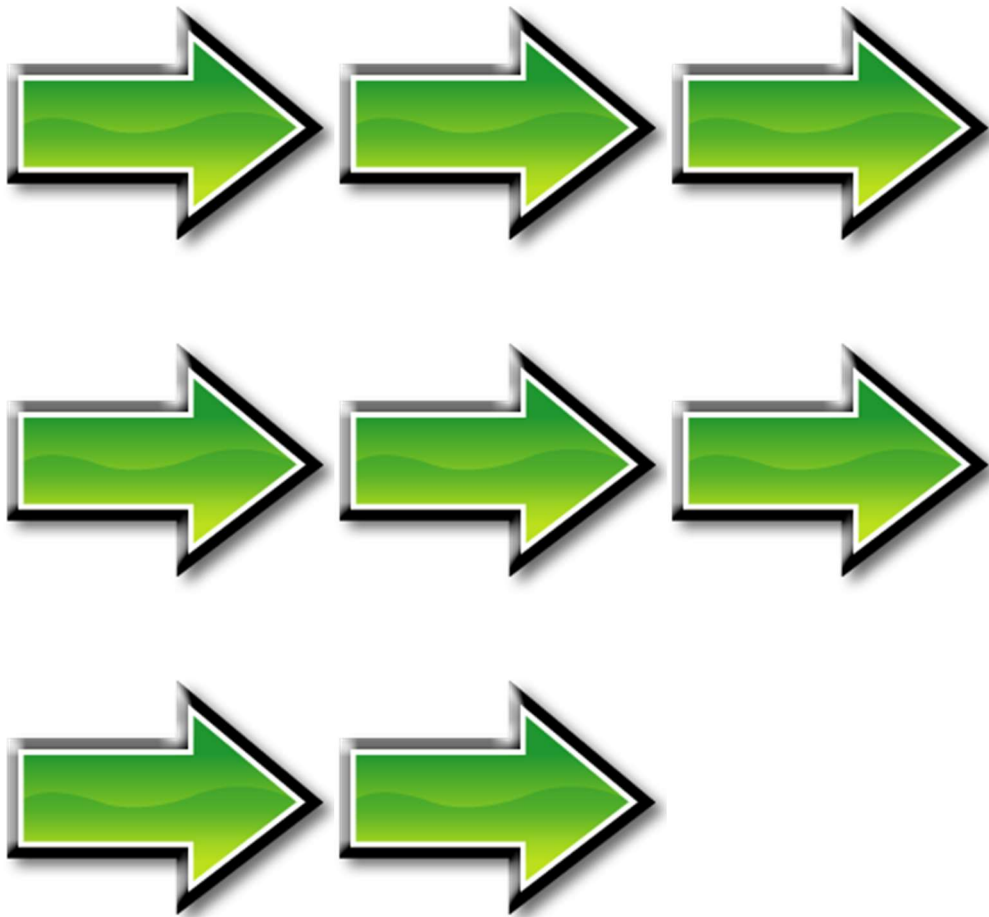

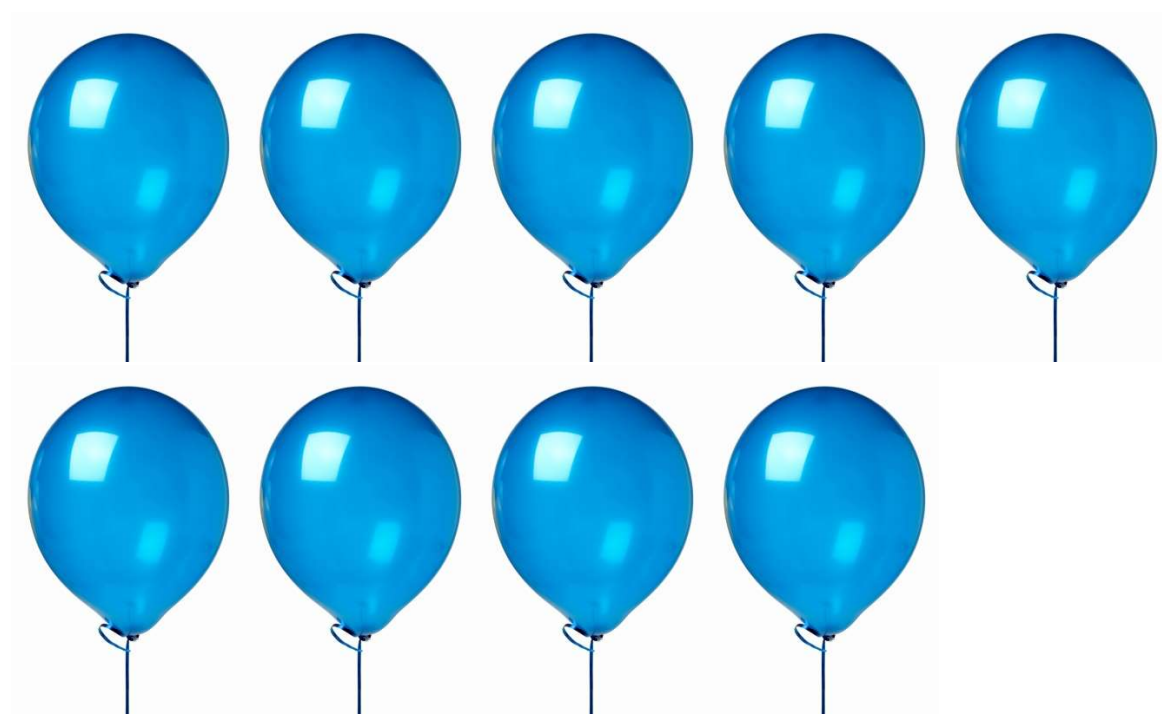

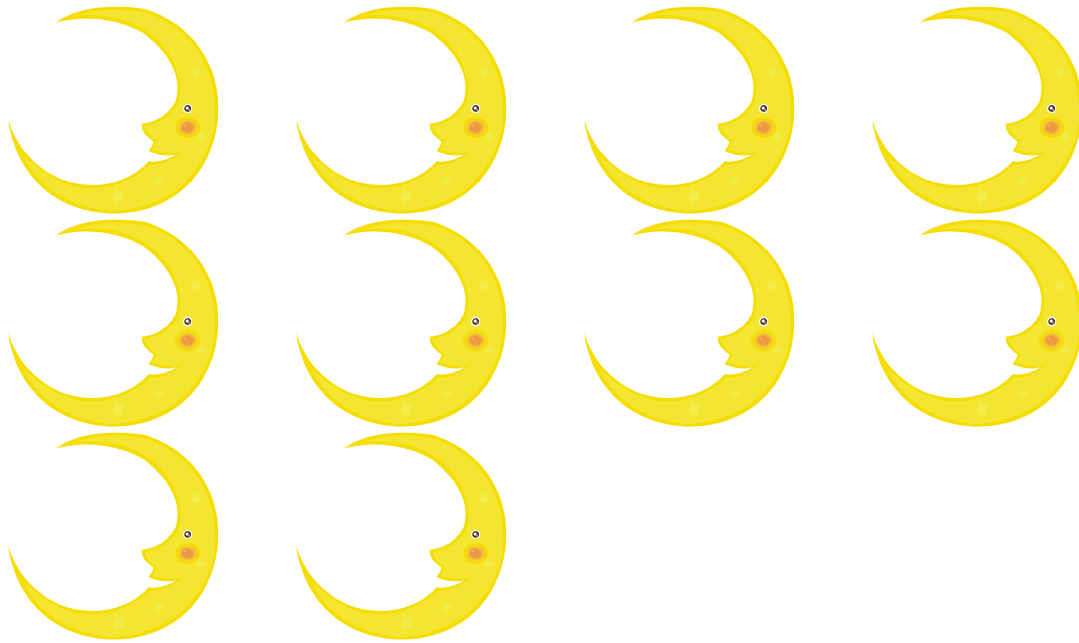
