Letter Name Identification

DIRECTIONS: Have your child read each letter one at a time, pointing to each letter. If your child hesitates for longer than five seconds or names the letter incorrectly, circle that letter and move on. Don't make a big deal about it. Do this work with your child with an encouraging smile. This should be fun and no stress! If your child is hungry or tired or otherwise not in a good mood, consider doing this practice at a different time when he or she might be more receptive. Once you are finished, help your child identify the letters that were incorrect. Tell and repeat is the best method of doing this. All letters should be practiced out of order and interchangeably (lowercase and uppercase mixed). Always end on a high note and congratulate your child for working hard!
