Principals and Directors of Operations manage our schools together in a co-leader partnership.

Directors of Operations oversee logistics to help schools function seamlessly. They focus on strategies and systems-building that provide staff and students with a welcoming school culture.



We offer students with special needs a wide range of services to effectively meet their academic, social, and emotional needs.

JOIN OUR TEAM OF SPECIAL EDUCATION EDUCATORS

Provide instruction to students with IEPs and 504s in the least restrictive environment. Through small-group instruction and a modified curriculum where needed, Special Education teachers ensure students have access to the same rigorous content as their general classroom peers.

Analyze student work to identify learning gaps and develop effective remediation and intervention strategies. In collaboration with General Education teachers, Special Education teachers differentiate content, and ensure curriculum is aligned to best support all students.



The path to certification

New hires receive support along with outstanding professional development, we provide new hires support and guidance throughout their certification process, including information sessions on certification requirements. All teachers are required to work towards certification*.

HOW UNCOMMON SCHOOLS SUPPORT TEACHERS

Teachers receive three weeks of high quality training prior to entering the classroom Apprentice teachers carry a reduced course load and are coached by mentor teachers All teachers receive three hours per week of professional development and collaborative work time

Teachers benefit from Uncommon's partnerships with education programs, including additional training and a subsidized cost of a master's degree and certification




